CONGRATULATIONS TO OUR SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS

At our Annual Meeting in June, five members of our Symphony were awarded \$500 each to pursue additional studies of their chosen instruments.

Funda Cizmecioglu (Violin) – will study with International Concert Artist Elmira Darvarova. She will prepare for recitals and explore violin techniques.

Michael Fittipaldi (Bass) – will study with Jeff Campbell, Professor of Jazz Studies, Eastman School of Music, in private instruction.

Alexsandra Labinska (Violin) – will study privately with Tamara Smirnova, Asst. Concertmaster of the Boston Symphony, to expand competence in orchestral playing.

Jamecyn Morey (Violin) –studied with Marc Rovetti, Asst. Concertmaster, Philadelphia Orchestra, while the Philadelphia Orchestra was in residence in Saratoga, focusing on general violin technique, orchestral repertoire and fundamentals of ensemble playing.

Yinbin Qian (Violin) – will study privately with Erica Kiesevretter, Concertmaster of the American Symphoy Orchestra, to focus on playing techniques and growing toward experience as an assistant concertmaster or concertmaster in the future.
