



#### **MOZART AND WINE IN TUSCANY**

We, as lovers of classical music, know that listening to Mozart, Beethoven, etc. gives us a good feeling, a relaxing feeling. But did you know that at a certain vineyard in Tuscany, juicier, sweeter grapes are produced by listening to Mozart? It is true! At the Mozart Vineyard in the hills of Montalcino, Giancarlo Cignozzi pipes in the beautiful sounds; the grapes closer to the speakers are more robust with a higher sugar content.

When word got out about this phenomenon, a plant scientist at the University of Florence became interested. At first he thought that Giancarlo was 'another crazy guy." Then Bose got involved, donating 72 speakers and financed more research.

The end result – Stefano Mancuso, the scientist, theorizes that the music resembles running water; the music confuses harmful bugs, making them unable to breed. The music also scares away birds and other creatures who feed on grapes. Perhaps it is just music and not necessarily Mozart and classical music that has produced a wonderful crop of grapes, but Giancarlo prefers classical music; he says he "prefers the music. Sorry, but I'm very romantic!"
